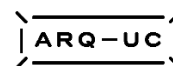

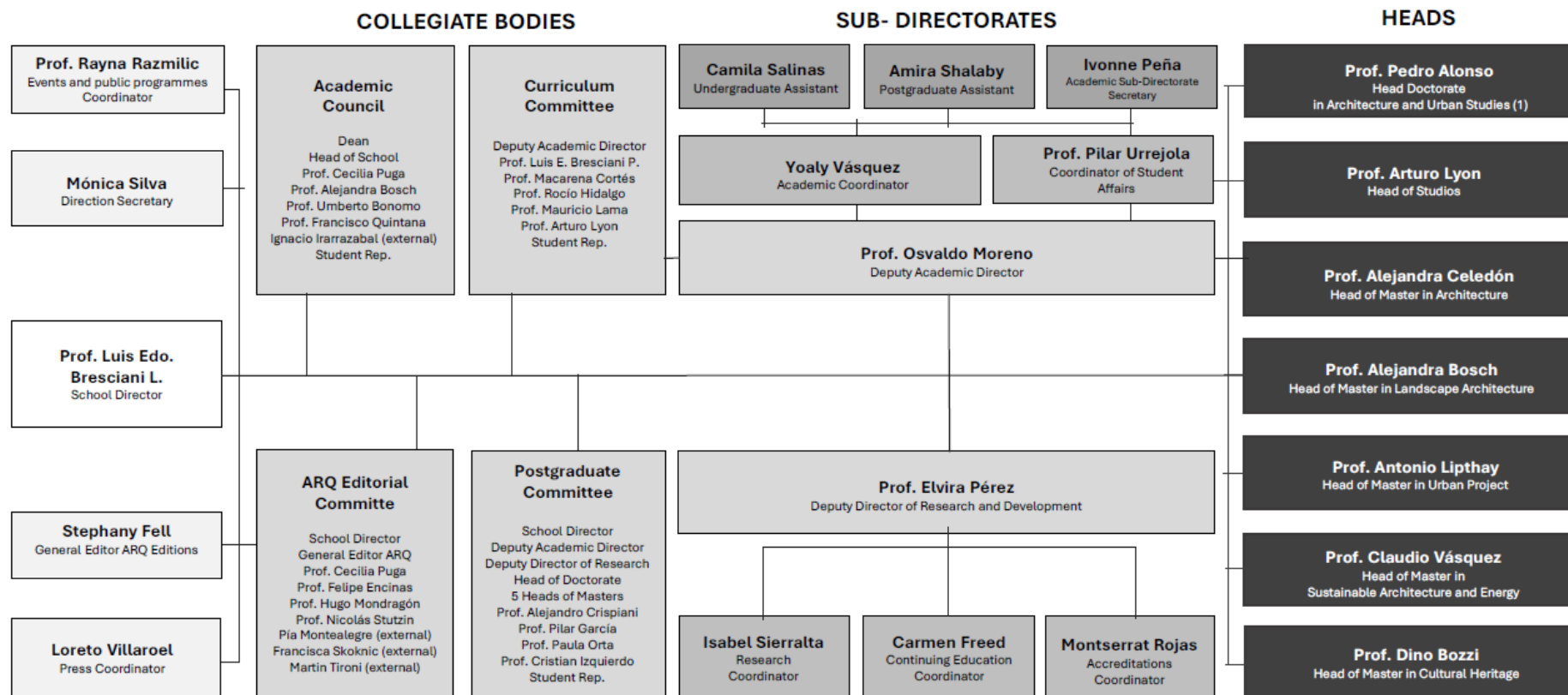

3.1. ARQ UC Academic Staff

Brief explanation of the ARQ UC Academic Categories

According to the "Faculty Rules of Policy and Management" (Art. 4), the faculty staff is nominated in categories according to their merits and their corresponding activities. The academic activities are the following:

1. Teaching or training of people
2. Research or creation in any of its forms
3. Outreach, dissemination, or application of each discipline
4. Management

There are three types of Academic categories classified as Tenured (Planta Ordinaria), Special Tenured (Planta Especial) and Non-tenured or Adjunct (Adjunto).

1. Tenured (Planta Ordinaria)

These members have a high dedication and permanent character with respect to their academic activities in teaching or training of persons and in research or creation in any of its forms. Every regular academic must perform two or more of the activities mentioned in Article 4 of these Regulations. Teaching or training of persons and research or creation, in any of its forms, constitute their common base. The rest of the dedication may be in any of the four activities, according to the characteristics of the academic and in accordance with his/her Faculty. The categories for Tenured faculty are, in hierarchical order:

- a. Professor <Titular>
- b. Associate <Asociado>
- c. Assistant <Asistente>

2. Special Tenured (Planta Especial) -> "Professors of Practice"

This new academic category is defined in the modification to the [Faculty Regulations DR78 /2018](#) and its members have a high dedication and permanent character with respect to their academic activities in teaching or training of persons or in research or creation in any of its forms. All Special Tenured academics must perform only one type of academic activity, whether it be teaching or training people, or research or creation in any of its forms, and be constantly updating their academic work. In cases where required, he/she may dedicate part of his/her working day to management, as indicated in Art. 71°. The categories for Special Tenured faculty are the following:

- a. Teaching Professors
- b. Clinical Professors, Professors of Practice, or Professors of the Profession
- c. Research Professors

3. Non-tenured or Adjunct (Adjunto)

The nontenured faculty have certain roles, appointed for fixed periods of time, which are renewable. The non-tenured positions include the following:

- a. Assistant Professor
- b. Adjunct Instructor
- c. Adjunct Researcher
- d. Visiting Professor

ARQUC hosts 215 faculty members. There are 48 Tenured and Especial Tenured faculty members and 167 non-Tenured faculty, Including Adjunct and Visiting Professors:

- A. Tenured Professors (35)
- B. Special Tenured Professors (13)²
- C. Non- Tenured Professors (167)

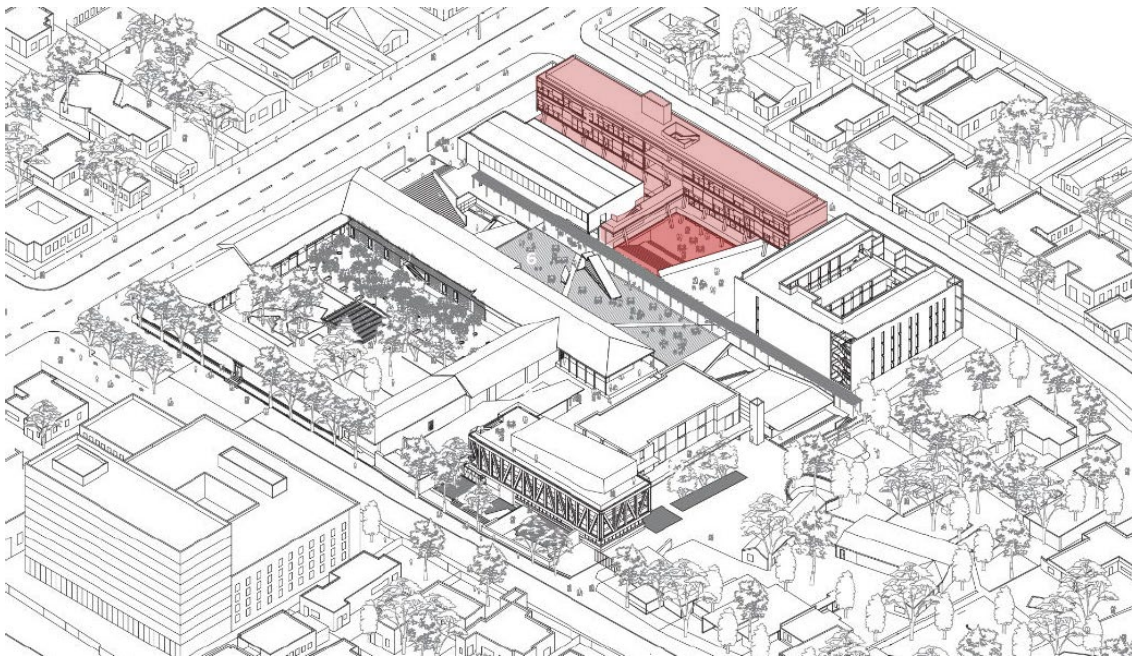


Figure 1. Lo Contador Campus, Alberto Moletto.

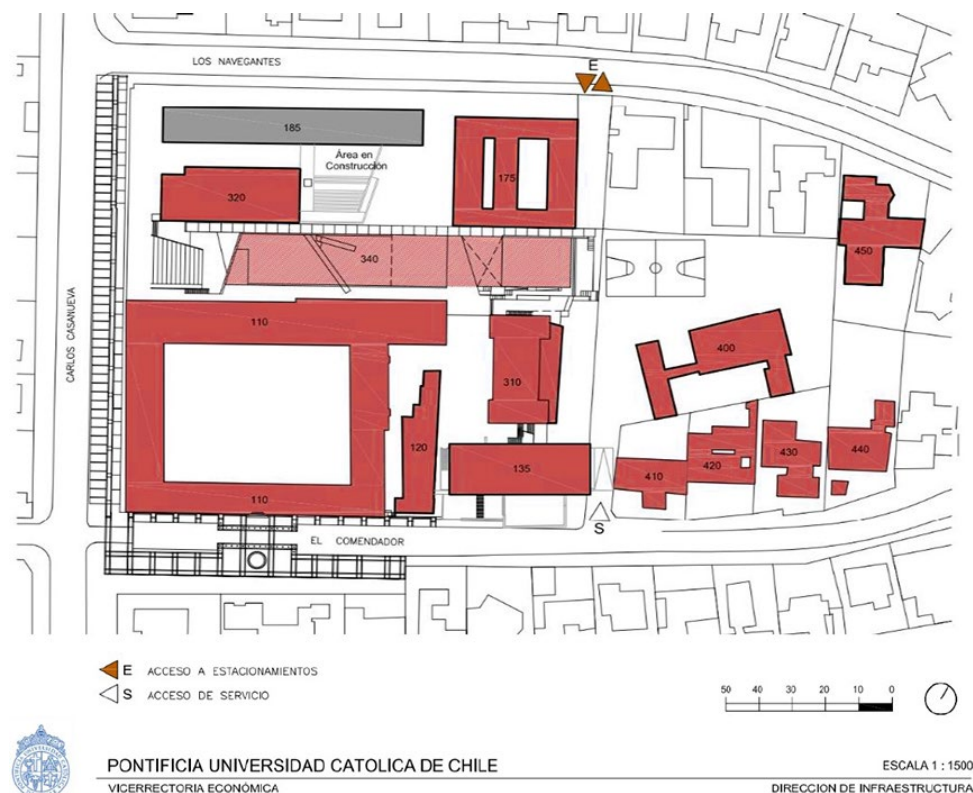


Figure 3. Lo Contador Campus Buildings.

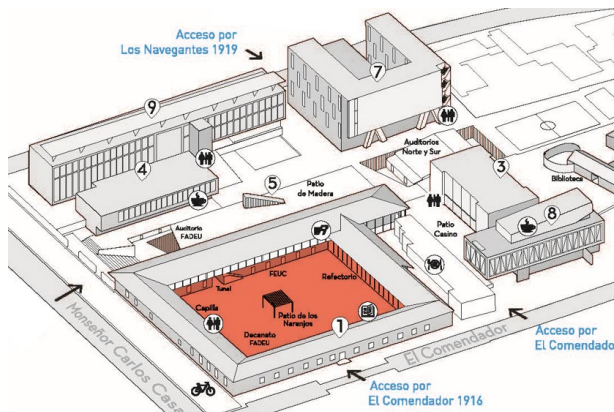

- La Casona for training levels (1st to 5th semester)



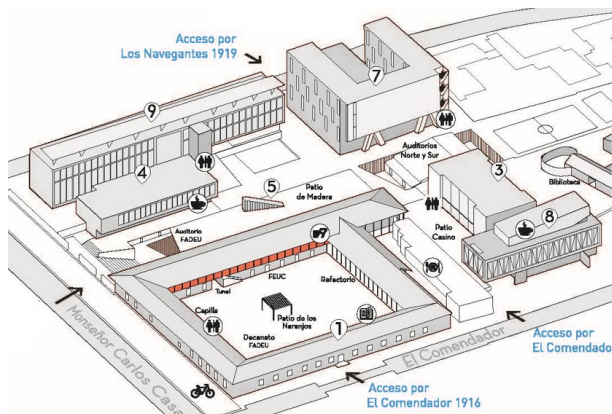

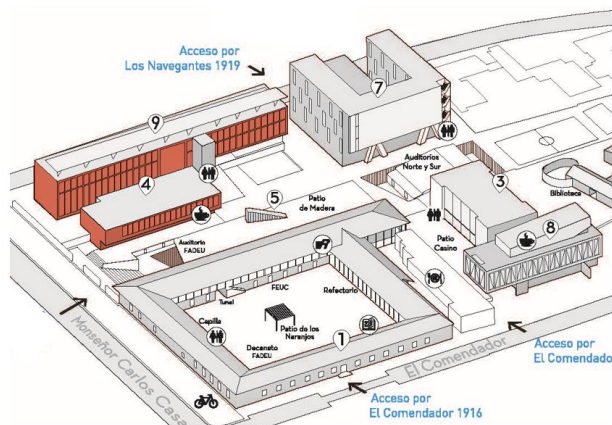

5. Assessment

The ARQ UC Studio Culture

Learning in the architectural discipline takes place mainly in Design Studios. This kind of education promotes each student's architecture learning through critical observation of reality, the rigorous study of disciplinary culture and the exercise of creativity. Encouraging the students to imagine innovative and informed solutions to address the complexity of reality, through projects that provide relevant answers to determined problems of society.

- **Collective Body:** The studio is a body that investigates a common subject, where ideas and discoveries are shared and discussed in a collaborative work. Critic sessions are collective and public, where the opinion of all members is valued, in an environment of respect where appropriate language is used to guide and inform students about their performance in a broader sense than just scores or qualification. Likewise, students must respond with an interested and self-critical attitude about their own performance.

- **Constructive Critic:** Critic must be respectful and constructive from academics, for students is an opportunity for discussion and learning in depth articulation of ideas through debate and the construction of an argument. It is also an opportunity to see themselves in relation to peers and to develop self-critic as a learning exercise.

- **Studio Exposed:** Studio work is exposed to external evaluation on its Final Review. This is a formal instance of communication of ideas and a fundamental part of learning. Academics present to the academic community the work of the semester and an external committee evaluates individual work of students.

- **Taking Care of Rigor in Work:** Commitment and rigor in work is stimulated in all members of the community: academics, students and staff. Perseverance is promoted in the teaching-learning process and in the search for the depth of ideas. Quality in results is based in respect for each other's and own work, and in special precision and care on the language used to communicate ideas.

- **Taking Care of Time:** Students are stimulated to distribute their time in a balanced manner, between courses and design studios, for which annual programming and scheduling of academic activities and evaluations is made. This programme is informed and published; it must be respected by the academic community. Punctuality is a value of coexistence between academics and students. This includes arrival times, beginning and end of classes, and timely delivery of work. Community is encouraged to have a healthy and balanced lifestyle, respecting the times of dedication to study or work activities and to develop a comprehensive and healthy life.

This Studio culture has been part of our identity since the beginning and has perpetuated as a characteristic seal in the programme structure. The alliance between the Studio modules with the obligatory theoretical and elective courses has strengthened our academic curriculum. The objective of these alliances is to achieve equilibrium between practical learning, through design exercises, and theoretical learning, evaluated through testing, written work, presentation, and other methods.

Evaluations of the architecture programme are principally through design exercises in Studio classes, but these types of exercises are also proposed in other courses. In fact, more than 50% of the credits that compose the architecture programme are acquired in obligatory courses evaluated through design exercises.

This includes the three Formative Studio and Representation modules (I, II and III – 60 credits in total), the Formative Studio IV and V modules (40 credits in total), the Research and Project Studio (20 credits), the Elective Studio I and II modules (30 credits in total), the Specialty Studio module (20 credits) and the Final Project I and II modules (40 credits in total). In total the Studio modules add up to 210 credits. In addition, the courses directly linked to Studio classes must be considered, such as the courses Introduction to Architecture linked to Formative Studio I and II, Introduction to Construction linked to Formative Studio III, Digital Production I and II modules (10 credits in total) linked to Formative Studio IV and V respectively, and the in-depth elective modules OPR linked to the Elective Studios I and II (10 credits in total). With these linked courses, another 30 credits are added.

Furthermore, the modules from the Technology and Construction Area: General Physics, Structural Elements and Seismic Resistant Form (10 credits each) are carried out through the experimental design of structures with the objective of providing the knowledge necessary to develop structurally innovative and correct architecture projects. In addition, these modules include the design and construction of structures at a real scale (Introduction to Building and Building and Techniques, 10 credits each) and the environmental improvement of existing buildings through architectonic design (Building Systems and Architectural Project, 10 credits).

In total the modules that are directly evaluated through design studio projects add up to 300 credits of the 550 that are needed to complete the programme. In addition, the modules of the area of Theory, History and Criticism and the area of City and Landscape, include design exercises and analysis of study cases of interest for each area. The details of evaluations can be found later in this document. Finally, it must be mentioned that many in-depth elective modules (OPR) also include design exercises as part of the evaluated coursework.

In particular, the methodology and evaluation of the modules is the following:

Studios

Although there is a common way of assessing studio work there are certain singularities according to the level. In Formative Studios and Representation I to III and Formative Studios IV and V the work is dominated by a weekly rhythm that includes:

- Presentation of an assignment, explained and delivered to the whole studio in an open session
- Evaluation and discussion over student's *work*, at group and personal studio critiques

The Research and Project Studios (semester 6) involve fewer students (15 maximum), introductory sessions, a plan of readings, analysis of research documentation (bibliographic) and case studies, internal and public exhibitions, site work and analysis and reconstruction of buildings, cities or landscapes.

The Elective Studios are also of small groups of students (up to 20), introductory lectures given by the academic staff, and invited specialists, documentation and research on similar cases (similar or related to the thematic), evaluation and discussion over student's *work*, at group and personal studio critiques and public exhibitions. Similarly, the Specialty Studio comprises a similar number of students separated according to the different master's programmes that FADEU offers.

In this level some of the Elective Studios participate in nacional and international competitions that dictate the studio programme, theme, methodology; preparing students for such challenges in their professional future. Some of the classic competitions in which our workshops participate are organised by the Chilean Wood Corporation - CORMA, CAP S.A. Main Steel Mining Group in Chile, Biennials, among others.

The final evaluation of these courses is carried out through public exams with an external commission⁴. This method of evaluation is considered one of the School's strengths and must be understood as a continuation of the exploration carried out during the semester, where the academic staff of different areas interacts with the students. At the end of the exam the juries along with the academic staff of the Studio establish the minimum passing level and grade the work.

The grading system includes a presentation grade and exam grade. The final grade is calculated giving a different weigh to the presentation grade according to the level of the studio, as follows:

Additionally, the Studio staff are allowed to use an extra 5% to lower or raise the final grade of the student. Student may be evaluated with the grade P of Pending when special health circumstances unable them to submit their exams (Medical Certificate must be presented).

In the **Formative Studios** exams, it is important to evaluate the quality of the proposed projects, giving greater importance to the design process, and the creativity and risk taken in the projects. In addition to that, Formative Studios are directly linked to the Representation area Modules. Hence, for each Studio Module there are specific representation exercises to provide the students technical tools and visual communications skills that aim to feed projects developed in the Studio Modules. The first three Studios' modules are called Studio and Representation, there the introduction to various representation media is covered, including traditional graphic and digital technology skills. Digital Production courses are parallel to Formation Studio IV and V and introduce a holistic production and representation of an architectural project addressing all of its scales. Some core courses, as the ones of the Urban Project Area or some electives, require expertise in digital media.

It is in the **Elective Studios** that the projects must have a greater degree of concreteness, over and above the general layout. At this level the projects should have the capacity of integrating the

complexity of the architectonic development especially regarding structural and material concepts and, urban and landscape design. It is of great importance that the external commission specify the parameters with which they are valuating, and that the studio academic staff specifies these when introducing the Studio to the jury.

PART 2

Specialty Studios (TES) consider an advanced level of projects in the specific subjects of each Master's degree. Their purpose is to address problems specific to the area in which students work, carrying out projects that incorporate technical strategies appropriate to the current state of the art and being critical of their own discipline.

It is of great importance that the external commission specify the parameters with which they are valuating, and that the studio academic staff specifies these when introducing the Studio to the jury.

Final Studios

1. **Research and Project Studio (TIP)** / Final Project I
2. **Advanced Research Studio (TIA) + Project Degree Studio (TPT)** / Final Project II

These Studios are carried out by the 4 Masters equally, with different themes and teachers to suit each specialty, but they share the same methodology as described below.

DESCRIPTION

The Studios in the final two semesters of the programme are focused on small groups that speculate on the different themes of the master's programme through a project and writing approach. During this period students gradually develop their project thesis from a set of consecutive and integrated studios: the Research and Project Studio -TIP- during the first semester and the Advanced Research Studio -TIA- during the second semester. Both workshops are guided by the same teaching team under the same theme in a continuous process.

Additionally, those students who are pursuing a Master's degree must also enroll in the Degree Project Workshop -TPT- during the second semester, which complements the Advanced Research Studio by going deeper into the field of project design.

CONTENTS

Each teaching or studio team will propose the thematic area in which the student's projects will be inscribed. Each student will define the line of research, the concepts, the theoretical contents, the working hypothesis, and the design contents to be contemplated in the project.

METHODOLOGY

- Project and research exercises.
- Exploration of representation tools
- Presentation of the project rationale

EVALUATION

The studio consists of a series of mandatory activities for the student where the development of the project will be systematically evaluated by the guiding teacher. However, the final evaluation will correspond to the presentation of the project in two instances before an Examining Committee:

- Intermediate exam: 30%.
- Final exam: 70%.

The Permanent Jury is a system in which a set of juries consisting of three permanent staff (and one replacement person) is assigned different Final Project Studios in accordance to their area of expertise. This way, each Permanent Jury evaluates the work done by the student in his/her Final Project at three moments: after finishing the TIP /Final Project I, in which the student presents the topic, programme, location and general layout plus the formulation of an initial research statement; at the TIA + TPT/ Final Project II exam, in which the student presents the design and research project at an advanced stage; and at the Final Exam, given eight weeks later, in which the students present the final results of design and research project.

It is important to point out that during this last eight weeks the student can count on the support of the teacher if required for scheduled corrections.

The TIP/ Final Project Studio I is completed as a Studio class guided by two professors, one with a professional orientation and the other with an orientation related to research and theory both which formulate an Studio with and specific line and general problematic in which students can develop their projects. In this context, the students develop a thematic study proposal that includes an investigation and its application as an architecture project. Then in TIA + TPT/ Project Studio II, this study is taken on as an architecture project guided by the professor with professional orientation and as a thesis for research in the Advanced Research in Architecture, City and Landscape module with the other professor.

Theoretical modules

The theoretical modules' system of assessment varies according to disciplinary areas and levels. In general terms the evaluation tools are written tests, oral interrogations, individual and group work, reports on visits, site work, bibliographic controls, research assignments and activities that allow the appreciation of abilities, aptitudes, knowledge and progress in the academic formation. The evaluations are in a scale from one to seven, where seven is excellent, six is very good, five is good, four is regular and the minimum passing grade, the grades below four a less than minimum to pass the course. Some theoretical modules ask a minimum of 75% or 80% assistance to class.

In the Theory, History and Critique disciplinary area the most common assessment methods are written tests, quizzes on relevant readings, the making of written or graphic work with the rigor of a research work. The Building, Technics and Energy disciplinary area privileges building site visits, case studies analyses, guest lecturers, compulsory readings, and the building of a personal portfolio. The General Physics module emphasizes the experimental approach. It is recommended to ask the students to do small experiments that can enlighten them in the relation between theory and experiment.

The Structural Elements and Seismic Resistant Form modules have a lecture modality, where the students are supposed to study the subjects treated in class with further bibliography, since the

students require to exercise to prepare for the written exams during the term. Nevertheless, practical exercises and the corroboration of the theory in models are the aim of the area. The City and Landscape disciplinary area considers the reading of texts that deal with the specific subject treated in class. These will be evaluated in reading exams and presentations. The modules also consider the making of group works where the students have to apply what they learned in class. The assessment methods and their respective percentages on the final grade of the minimum modules are the following:

- **Representation Area**

- AQR1000 Digital Production I: Weekly tasks submitted in digital format (70%) and a final exam (30%). A minimum of 80% assistance is needed to pass.
- AQR2000 Digital Production II: Three intermediate tasks (5%, 5%, 30% respectively) and a final exam that represents the 60% of the grade. A minimum of 75% assistance is needed to pass.

- **Theory, History and Critique Area**

- AQH0000 Introduction to Architecture: Reading tests (25%), Practical works (25%), module's drawing binnacle (25%) and a Final Exam (25%). A minimum of 80% assistance is needed to pass.
- AQH0200 Ancient Architecture and the Classical Tradition: Reading tests (25%), Practical works (25%), intermediate exams (25%) and a Final Exam (25%). A minimum of 80% assistance is needed to pass.
- AQH0300 Architecture and the Modern Tradition: 2 written tests (60%), Archive and Research work (10%), Analytical models and drawings (10%) and Final essay (20%).
- AQH0400 Contemporary Architecture Debates: Group reading discussions (30%) and a Final Oral Exam (70%)

- **City and Landscape Area**

- AQU0000 City and Landscape I: Written Test (20%), 2 group Urban Analysis works (50%), Participation grade (10%) and Final Exam (30%). A minimum of 80% assistance is needed to pass.
- AQU0200 City and Landscape II: Written Test (20%), 2 group Urban Analysis works (50%), Participation grade (10%) and Final Exam (30%).
- AQU0300 City and Landscape III: Weekly tests and participation (40%), group Case Study Analysis work (30%) and a Final Essay (30%)
- AQU0400 City and Landscape IV: Weekly written tests (40%), Reading's Presentations (30%) and Field work (30%). A minimum of 80% assistance is needed to pass.

- **Building, Technics and Energy Area**

- AQC0100 Introduction to Building: Weekly written tests (40%), Practical works (25%) and a Final Exam (35%). A minimum of 90% assistance is needed to pass.
- AQC0101 Building Site Experience I: Formally demonstrate that a minimum of 70 hours in the Building Site have been achieved. To submit a dossier with tasks associated to each topic of the module. The assistance of the lectures and correction sessions is mandatory to pass.

- AQC0200 Building and Techniques: Three written tests (75%) and a Practical work (25%)
- AQC0202 Building Site Experience II: Formally demonstrate that a minimum of 70 hours in the Building Site have been achieved. To submit a dossier with tasks associated to each topic of the module. The assistance of the lectures and correction sessions is mandatory to pass.
- AQC0300 Building Systems and Architectural Project: Two written tests (35%), Two practical works (10% and 20% respectively) and a Final exam (35%)
- FIS1032 General Physics: Three written tests (70%) and a Final exam 30%
- AQC0110 Structural Elements: Practical exercises, two written tests (50%), four quizzes (25%) and a Final Exam (25%)
- AQC0210 Seismic Resistant Form: 3 written tests (30%, 30% and 40% respectively). A minimum of 80% assistance is needed to pass.

While the evaluation method varies for each module according to the professors, the School provides two specific testing weeks for the Project Studio modules during the semester, in addition to one week of exams for all other courses. During the exam week period, students devote their efforts to the theoretical modules; Studio modules do not require design exercises during this period to avoid overloading the students.

8. Professional practical experience /PPE

Practical experiences are mandatory in our curriculum by allowing our students direct experience with the professional reality of the discipline. These experiences are conceived and designed to be a central learning element in the education of an architect firmly rooted in the real world with real world solutions to specific problems. The value of this approach lies in its proximity to professional reality and gives students the opportunity to use elements taken from their university experience and apply them in a practical way. In this way, the student will embody and synthesise the key elements necessary for the full and proper exercise of our discipline.

We consider it essential to provide the university, and in particular our School, with new issues and problems to face, strengthening our relationship with society. Students are expected to deepen and complement their skills and abilities to solve the various demands that an architectural work necessarily entails, such as construction, legal issues, technology, and design issues. At the same time, students are expected to engage with the realities of poverty in such a way that they understand, study and work with the problems of poverty.

This is carried out by 4 practical experiences:

1. Building Site Experiences, I and II.
2. Practical Professional (Office) Experience.
3. Practical Service Experience.

ARQ UC provides students with a wide network of contacts in construction companies, institutions, and professional architectural firms, as well as an internship staff that guides students and approves the "Internship Plan", a mandatory document that students must submit before the start of their internship. This permanent link, especially with our alumni, allows our students to maintain contact with the professional sector once they have graduated.

In addition, there is a wide range of internships offered to our students in prestigious law firms abroad. Students participating in the "Study Abroad" programme usually apply to firms to carry out the Practical Office Experience, also some of our regular students apply for summer internships abroad, having the opportunity to get to know the professional world in a different context and to broaden their knowledge base.

9. Admissions

The admission to Chilean universities is historically done on an annual basis. The institutions responsible for managing the admissions process are the Ministry of Education together with the Department of Evaluation, Measurement and Registration of Education (DEMRE). The main instrument that defines the possibilities of being selected to enter a Chilean university is a standardized test, which as of December 2022 is the Higher Education Access Test, also called (PAES)⁵.

Currently, there are 2 processes: centralized admission and direct admission. Centralized admission (also called regular admission) is the main and most popular admission mechanism and is common to 45 universities nationwide. Direct admission (also called special admission) corresponds to special processes specific to the universities.

The ARQ UC Admission Policy complies with the two national university admission systems.

- **Advances and policies on gender diversity issues**

- **Gender Equity Direction ([DEG](#)):** *Building a UC with equity and diversity*

The DEG includes professors, student representatives and professionals, and its motivation is to generate a permanent working instance around gender equity. The unit is housed in the UC Academic Vice Rectory and has 5 main lines of work, which are fundamental to advance in the consolidation of a more equitable, inclusive, and diverse academic community:

- Increase the proportion of women in the Regular and Special Plants, ensuring equitable selection processes.
- Promote gender equity -> equal opportunities between men and women in decision-making and authorities.
- Improve processes to ensure the adequate development of women's academic careers.
- Integrate equal opportunities between men and women, in the university's culture, graduate profile and pedagogical practices.
- Promote actions that allow the conciliation between work, family, and personal life.

The Gender Equity Office, in collaboration with the [Center for Faculty Development](#), carries out activities that promote knowledge and implementation of diversity and equity policies, such as Seminars, Workshops, and Courses among others.³¹ Some interesting reports, content and policies such as ["Hiring and Academic Staff 2014-2019 Study"](#), ["Women in Academia Report"](#), among others, can be found at DEG's [website](#).

These efforts have proven fruitful, as UC celebrated its position this year as the most advanced in gender equity issues at the national level, according to the Times Higher Education Ranking (2022).⁷ The evaluation considered aspects such as research on gender issues within the universities, policies aimed at gender equity, and the commitment to hiring and promotion of women within the campuses.

This is a good sign and an indicator that we are moving in the right direction, although there is still a long way to go. In times of pandemic, the need to incorporate practices that advanced towards the reconciliation and compatibility of work, personal and family life were identified. Today, more than ever, it is important to make gender gaps visible and foster a culture of co-responsibility in the community.

At the Faculty (FADEU) level, we have the:

- **Gender Equity and Good Treatment Unit ([DEGY](#))** was created with the objective of taking care of aspects related to Good Treatment, Inclusion and Gender Equity of FADEU's community. The unit's goals are the following:

- Provide a space for welcoming, dialogue and inclusive communication for the entire FADEU community.
- Promote an organizational culture of good practices, respect and good treatment, and to these ends propose internal measures and evaluate results.

- Be a space for information, support and monitoring; in relation to the policies, standards, and procedures that the university has implemented in this regard.
- Identify and evaluate factors or areas in which the faculty should make changes regarding actions that threaten equity, respect and good treatment of its members. Propose measures and/or internal policies.
- Welcome, support, and counsel victims of sexual abuse or harassment. (Represents UVS)
- Promote an academic career with equal opportunities by providing support to the Office of the Academic Secretary.

- **Projection of our diversity and Inclusive Community**

- **Resources section, UC Direction of Inclusion:** *An inclusive community.*

Inclusion is built into the daily tasks of students, academics, and work, through specific and cross-cutting contributions. The Inclusion Direction provides workshops and training for the Academic Units and students. See list here: <https://inclusion.uc.cl/comunidad-inclusiva/>

- **Social diversity and inclusion initiatives:** *Linking with the environment and student social engagement.*

These are social projects designed by students or any member of the UC community, which through university or academic volunteering, implement interventions in education, health, sustainability, construction and housing, academic support, political training and / or cultural management, oriented to the UC community or people, groups and / or external communities (children, youth, adults, seniors). Some outstanding initiatives are "[Jóvenes sin Fronteras](#)" – "*Youth without borders*", a project created by UC students who believe in a Chile that is supportive and responsible with those most in need and "[Trabajo País](#)" a project in service of all the dioceses of Chile to work with localities that need a physical space for meeting and developing community life and to build social centers, squares and libraries, among others.

- **Lo Contador Census:** *Getting to know our diverse FADEU community.*

In 2011, five FADEU students, among them the student representatives, had the idea of "x-raying" the Lo Contador Campus, and for this purpose, they elaborated a statistical profile of its students. This work arose as a response to a realization that, up to that moment, all the different projects that were being carried out were based on myths or personal perceptions of reality. As a final product, the book "[Lo Contador Census 2013: Myths and Realities](#)" was published, capturing in numbers, a real portrait of FADEU students at that time.

In 2022, the Territorial Representative of students of the Lo Contador Campus reactivated this initiative by implementing a new Census, whose consultation process was developed via an anonymous Google form, between September and November. Along with the UC Student Federation (FEUC), the Superior Counseling and the FADEU community, how to adapt the previous Census questions to the current reality was discussed. In response, new questions were included about maternity and paternity, neurodivergent issues such as attentional deficit, autism, among others. As a novelty, dietary issues were also included to ensure that the campus cafeterias offer food according to the needs of our students, whose preferences for vegan and vegetarian diets have increased in a high percentage. Finally, questions were asked again about gender identity and sexual orientation, a point in which great changes have been observed in the last 9 years. Although this is a student initiative, it has full FADEU's support, and a book is expected to be published with the results in 2023.
